





PRE-ATTACK BEHAVIOR

- Personal Loss
- Lack of interest in non-violent solutions (85%)
- Pervasive, persistent fantasies of victimization
- Revenge
- Bully Behavior (93% made threats)
- Coping/isolation issues
- Dramatic behaviors (fixation 41%)
- Leakage critical for review (the list*)
- Behavior is critical
- * Case Southern U.S.



CONCERNING BEHAVIOR

- Social media posts with alarming content
- Escalating anger or aggressive behavior
- Changes in behavior and appearance (Tyler 2018)
- Expressions of suicidal ideations
- Writing about violence or weapons
- Cutting off communications
- Inappropriate behavior toward females



CONCERNING BEHAVIOR

- Stalking/harassing behavior
- Increased depression
- Increased drug use
- Erratic behavior
- Purchasing weapons
- Threats of domestic violence (30%)
- Acting Paranoid

CASE STUDY: OVERFLOW OF VIOLENCE

- Location: Somewhere North Texas
- Nine-month employee to be termed for performance
- Religious Zealot
- Anti-government views
- Gun-nut
- Two weeks before made threat at manager
- Two weeks before bought suppressor



CASE STUDY: ISSUES?

- Location: Somewhere not in Texas
- VP suspended for assault of female employee
- Known alcohol abuser
- Owes the company \$76,000
- Stated: "if you take everything from me, I'll take everything from you"
- Cleaned out desk: 100+ viles of steroids and syringes




CASE STUDY: DISCIPLINE ISSUE

- Kraft Philly: 2010 Suspended returned 10 minutes later. Two dead, one injured.
- Budweiser Hartford: 2010 Termed for theft. Eight dead, two injured.
- Pillsbury Indiana: One dead.
- Coors, WI: 2020: Six dead
- UPS, CA: 2020: Threats made by employee. 20,000 rounds of ammo, multiple weapons and backpack with magazines at the door.



CASE STUDY: 2014 UC SANTA BARBARA

- Asian/American
- Father Hunger Games
- Killed 6 , injured 14 (2 knives/2 guns)
- 3 in apartment
- Targeted Violence
- Hypervigilant Narcissist
- Punish women for rejecting him
- Envied sexual activity
- Sent warning signs
- Practiced
- Friends were paid for



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
